

This image shows a guidewire in the preferred view during central line placement. This view is in the **Lung** axis.

This image shows **Fluid** between the liver and kidney in the hepatorenal space.

This clips shows sliding **B** lines, which if bilateral in the anterior lung fields are indicative of pulmonary edema.

Kissing ventricles in the parasternal **short** axis view indicates hypovolemia or acute hemorrhage. This axis is at the **papillary** muscle level, and is the preferred level to evaluate left ventricle function.

Consolidated lung with mobile hyperechoic structures, or **Air bronchograms**, are indicative of pneumonia.
