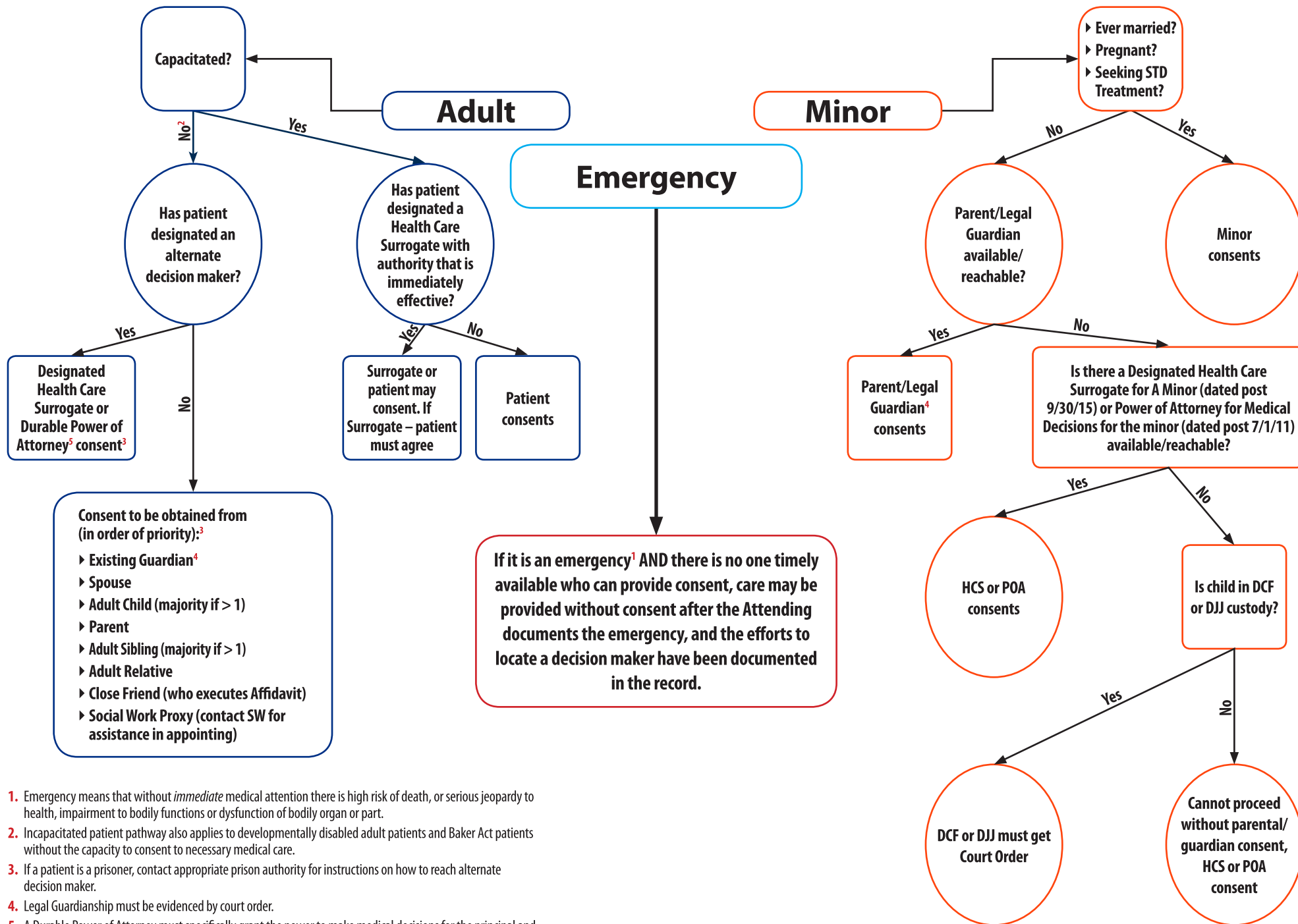


INFORMED CONSENT



1. Emergency means that without *immediate* medical attention there is high risk of death, or serious jeopardy to health, impairment to bodily functions or dysfunction of bodily organ or part.
2. Incapacitated patient pathway also applies to developmentally disabled adult patients and Baker Act patients without the capacity to consent to necessary medical care.
3. If a patient is a prisoner, contact appropriate prison authority for instructions on how to reach alternate decision maker.
4. Legal Guardianship must be evidenced by court order.
5. A Durable Power of Attorney must specifically grant the power to make medical decisions for the principal and must have language stating that it is effective despite incapacitation of the principal.
